## Notice To Competitors

**USDAA Rules:** USDAA's official rules & regulations are hereby incorporated by reference, a copy of which may be obtained by sending \$7.00 (postage & handling included) to: USDAA, P.O. Box 850955, Richardson, TX 75085-0955. Competitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA rules and regulations including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry:

- All dogs must be registered with USDAA. Registration may be made concurrently with your entry
  using the form provided in this test schedule. You may register online at <a href="www.usdaa.com">www.usdaa.com</a>, click on
  General Information, Dog Registration, to receive a registration number immediately and a measurement card prior to the show.
- This test is open to all dogs at least 18 months of age, including purebred and nonpurebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness that may affect the dog's ability to perform safely, or dogs showing aggression.
- No collars, leads, food, toys, or other aids or devices are allowed on a course at any time. USDAA
  regulations forbid any and all training, choke, pinch, or shock collars on or around the course at any
  time
- The Trial Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee view that participation by competitor or dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for their decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Trial Committee.
- You alone are responsible for the behavior of your dogs and children. If your dogs or children create
  unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior, the Trial Committee can ask you to leave the show site. In such case, we will not refund any fees.
- Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. There will be a \$20.00 service charge for returned checks. Payment of entry fees and service charges shall be made in cash or money order within 30 days of postmark of notice of returned check where notification is received after event date. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration number(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is canceled without recourse by owner/handler.
- Running Order and Limits: In the event of a large entry, time/fault limits may be established by the
  Trial committee and judge. This means that after receiving a certain number of faults, you may be
  asked to leave the ring without completing the course.
- Refunds: Refunds (less USDAA recording fees and judges fees) are given for bitches that come into season after the closing date. No refund for entries withdrawn after closing date, or if a dog or handler is dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason. No refund is given if the test cannot open or be completed due to riots, civil disturbances, fire, acts of god, public emergency, acts of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the Trial Committee's control.

Advancements in Level after Closing Date: We will advance your level if you achieve a title after the closing date. Contact Karey Krauter (kkrauter@bayteam.org) 650-926-3674 before 10 PM Monday April 1. You cannot advance your level at this trial if you achieve a title at this trial.

## Checking in and Measuring in

Check-in rules: All competitors must check in at the check in table during the morning check-in time. Competitors that included a copy of their yellow (NOT BLUE!) permanent height card with their entry form will receive an expedited check-in. If your check-in is expedited in this manner then you are exempt from measuring in.

Measure-in rules: All dogs must be measured in during the morning check-in time except for [1] dogs jumping 26" (22" performance), [2] dogs that have a permanent yellow height card, [3] dogs that have a blue temporary height card with three signatures on it, or [4] dogs that have a check-in letter provided by USDAA office.

## **Championship Tournament Descriptions**

#### 2005 USDAA® Grand Prix of Dog Agility® World Championships Local Qualifier

This class is open to all dogs regardless of title or skill level - a single-round tournament featuring the sport in its basic form. The course includes an A-frame, dog walk, see-saw, pipe tunnel, collapsed tunnel, weave poles, tire jump and a variety of other jumps and hurdles. Scoring follows regulations for standard scoring under Masters rules, except that time standards may generally range from 3.50 yards per second to 3.75 yards per second for dogs competing in the 22" and 26" height classes and from 2.85 to 3.05 yards per second in the 12" height class and from 3.10 to 3.40 yards per second for dogs competing in the 16" height class. Dogs that earn seven (7) or fewer faults shall earn a qualifying score and shall qualify to enter one of the Regional Championship events. Two (2) qualifying rounds (one of which may be earned in Round 1 of a Regional Championship) are required for entry to the World Championship quarterfinals. A complete copy of the 2005 tournament rules, which are hereby incorporated by reference, will be posted at the event, or may be obtained directly from USDAA.

#### Dog Agility Steeplechase

The Steeplechase is a two-round tournament with emphasis on speed. Each round will be conducted on a jumpers-style course with the inclusion of an A-Frame and weave poles, either of which shall be required to be performed twice. The top 30% of competitors (min of four, some of whom may be nonqualifiers; see qualifying rules below) shall advance to Round 2 to compete for prize money and Tournament Top Ten points. However a competitor who received an elimination in Round 1 is ineligible to advance. This tournament is open to all competitors (i.e. starters, advanced, or masters) regardless of previous accomplishments in competition.

Scoring: The tournament shall be conducted pursuant to USDAA Championship Program rules as stipulated herein. Scoring in each round shall be on a time plus faults basis with a five point penalty added to a competitor's performance time for ea occurrence of fallen hurdle or missed contact.. Running the wrong course shall be scored as an elimination as determined under Masters level rules. No refusals or missed weave poles shall be penalized, however all obstacles must be completed before continuing on the remainder of the course.

Qualification: Only competitors placing in the top 30% of the number competing in their height class shall qualify. Those earning a qualifying score are eligible for entry to the Dog Agility Steeplechase Championship to be held in the autumn of 2005.

#### **Championship Tournament Descriptions, continued**]

Dog Agility Masters Team Tournament

This tournament is open to all dogs, regardless of competition level. A team may comprise of dogs from any two height classes (e.g. 12"/26", 16"/26", 22"/22", etc). Each individual on a three-dog/three-handler team competes in four classes of competition--Standard agility, Snooker, Jumpers, and Gamblers choice. Qualifying teams then compete in a fifth and final class – the three-dog team relay. Team prizes and awards will be made based on scores after five rounds[Special Note: Each of three handlers and dogs must compete in all five classes; i.e., two different dogs on a team may not both be handled by a single handler. In the event a handler on a team is unable to continue through all of the classes, one handler substitution OUT OF NECESSITY with the approval of the judge may be made. In the event one or more dogs on a team are unable to compete after the first class, the team may not seek replacement(s). The remaining team members may compete in individual classes, but are not eligible for three-dog relay.]

Each of the five classes will be conducted pursuant to USDAA Rules and Regulations, except that performance requirements are subject to judge's discretion. The following differences are specifically noted:

The performance requirements of the Standard agility class and team relay class as specified in Chapter 3 & 6 shall exclude the table and may omit one contact obstacle at judge's discretion.

The performance requirements of the Snooker, Gamblers and Jumpers classes shall generally follow the requirements of Chapter 6 except that [1] the Jumpers class will include the weave poles and may omit one or more spread hurdles, [2] the Gamblers class may include or omit rules normally applied.

Masters scoring shall apply to all classes in this tournament with the following exceptions. [1] Each refusal is worth two faults and [2] three refusals per dog or one wrong course per dog is worth one-third of the class point value. Time penalties shall not apply in Standard, Jumpers, or Team Relay classes as these classes shall be scored on a time plus faults basis for the tournament.

Team rankings and placements shall be on the basis of cumulative scores through the five classes of competition. Points will be allocated to the Team Standard class, Jumpers class, and Relay class in the amount of 390 points for the Standard agility class, 300 points for the Jumpers class, and 450 points for the Relay class. The combined individual performance scores in Standard agility, Jumpers, and Relay classes shall be computed on a time plus faults basis and subtracted from the course point value to determine the final team score for the class. A handicapping system (available at the event) will be employed when computing scores for dogs in the mini division on each team. Points earned in the Gamblers and Snooker agility classes will be added to the team score, but may be multiplied by a factor to increase or decrease the "weight" of these classes relative to the other tournament classes. For example, a team's final gamblers score of 75 points may be multiplied by a factor of 1.5 for a total score of 112.50. The weighting factor will be posted and/or announced at the event prior to the start of the tournament, once the judge's scoring system has been determined. The GREATER of the top 50% of the teams OR those teams scoring at least 25% of the points earned by the top three teams after the fifth and final class shall qualify for entry into the Championship event. The Dog Agility Masters Team Tournament is a championship program only. A complete copy of the championship tournament rules may be obtained from USDAA.

Note 2004 changed team rule: Team classes do NOT count towards titles.

You may enter Team as a Draw. The draw will be drawn after the closing date. If at that time there are not a perfect multiple of three dogs entered in the team draw, the odd dog(s) at the conclusion of the draw will have their team entry monies refunded, with apologies.

## Performance Tournament Descriptions

## 2005 USDAA® National Performance Championships™ Local Qualifier (Formerly called Performance Grand Prix)

This class is also open to all dogs regardless of title or skill level and utilizes the rules and course design outlined for the Grand Prix of Dog Agility\*. The standard course time for this class will be calculated by adding three (3) seconds to the standard course time as determined for Grand Prix. Dogs that earn seven (7) or fewer faults shall earn a qualifying score and shall qualify to enter one of the Regional Championship events. Two (2) qualifying rounds (one of which may be earned in Round 1 of a Regional Championship) are required for entry to the Nationals Performance Championships quarterfinals. A complete copy of the 2005 tournament rules are hereby incorporated by reference.

**Performance Leap'n'Chase**: This two-round class is open to all dogs not entered in the championship Steeplechase tournament at this event and is a non-qualifying non-titling class. Dogs will run on the Steeplechase courses as modified in accordance with the Performance Program. Scores will be cumulative from both rounds, but any dog scoring an elimination in Round 1 will not advance to Round 2. Scoring shall be on a time plus faults basis with a five point penalty added to the competitor's time for each occurrence of a fallen hurdle or missed contact. Running the wrong course shall be scored as a elimination. No refusals or missed weave poles shall be penalized; however, all obstacles must be completed before continuing on the remainder of the course.

**Performance Pairs Pentathlon:** These classes are open to all dogs not entered in the Dog Agility Masters Team Tournament. A pentathlon pair is comprised of dogs from any height classes. Each individual in a two-dog/two-handler pair competes in four classes of competition – standard, snooker, jumpers, and gamblers. All pairs that have not been eliminated then compete in a fifth and final class – the two-dog relay. Prizes and awards will be made based upon the scores after five rounds. Each of the two handlers and dogs must compete in all five classes; i.e. two different dogs in a pair may not be both handled by a single handler.

Regarding substitutions: In the event one handler is unable to continue, a substitution – out of necessity and with the approval of the judge – may be made so long as it is made before either dog runs the first class. The substituted handler may not already be a member of a pair. In the event one or more dogs in a pair are unable to compete after the first class, the pair may not seek replacement(s). The remaining pair member may compete in individual classes, but are not eligible for the relay.

Each of the five classes will be conducted pursuant to USDAA Rules & Regulations, except that performance requirements are subject to judge's discretion. Specifically, the performance requirements of the standard agility class and the tournament pairs relay class as specified in Chapters 3 & 6 shall exclude the table and may omit one contact obstacle. The performance requirements of the snooker, gamblers, and jumpers classes shall generally follow the requirements of Chapter 6, except that the jumpers class will include weave poles and the gamblers class may include or omit rules normally applied.

Masters scoring shall apply to all classes in this tournament with the following exceptions. Two (2) faults instead of five (5), and three (3) refusals or wrong courses shall result in a loss of the Class Point Value. Time penalties shall not apply in Standard, Jumpers, or Pairs Relay classes as these classes shall be scored on a time plus faults basis for the tournament. Pairs who are eliminated are ineligible for the relay.

Pairs rankings and placements shall be on the basis of cumulative scores through the five classes of competition. Points will be allocated to the Standard class, Jumpers class, and Relay class in the amount of 260 points for the Standard agility class, 200 points for the Jumpers class, and 300 points for the Relay class. The combined individual performance scores in Standard agility, Jumpers, and Relay classes shall be computed on a time plus faults basis and subtracted from the course point value to determine the final pairs score for the class. Points earned in the Gamblers and Snooker agility classes will be added to the pairs score, but may be multiplied by a factor to increase or decrease the "weight" of these classes relative to the other tournament classes. For example, a pair's final gamblers score of 75 points may be multiplied by a factor of 1.5 for a total score of 112.50. The weighting factor will be posted and/or announced at the event prior to the start of the tournament, once the judge's scoring system has been determined.

You may enter Pentathlon as a Draw. The draw will be drawn after the closing date. If at that time there are not a perfect multiple of two dogs entered in the team draw, the odd dog at the conclusion of the draw will have their pentathlon entry monies refunded, with apologies.

#### **Awards**

Ribbons will be self-serve at this trial. Instructions will be copious at the awards table.

- Placement ribbons: 1st\_4th place ribbons in each height class. 1st\_4th place ribbons for each of the Pairs mini and open divisions. Oscar's Pairs will be 1st\_4th overall.
- Qualifying ribbons: A maroon rosette for a qualifying score in all classes that apply; a black and maroon rosette for Masters super-qualifying Snooker score.
- New Title ribbons will be awarded to anyone earning a versatility title at this event (AD, AAD, MAD).
- Big Title ribbons will be awarded to anyone earning an ADCH, APD, or TM title at this trial. These ribbons will be personalized after the fact.
- Grand Prix rosettes will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> place in each jump height. Maroon and white ribbons will be awarded for all qualifying scores.
- National Performance Championships (formerly Performance Grand Prix) rosettes will be awarded for 1st through 4th place in each jump height. Maroon and pink ribbons will be awarded for all qualifying scores.
- Dog Agility Steeplechase: "I made the cut" ribbons for anyone advancing to Round 2 (note that advancing to round two no longer means you automatically qualify). Placement ribbons for 1<sup>st</sup>–6<sup>th</sup> place winners at each height of Round 2. Prize money shall be computed based upon 30% of the total entry fees for the tournament class for all jump heights collectively, or such greater amount per height class that a host organization may designate. Allocable prize money at local and regional qualifying events shall be distributed among eligible finalists in accordance with the following prize allocation table, regardless of the size of entry in the class; however allocable amounts to the finalist positions that are not filled for any reason or allocable prize amounts less than \$1.00 shall be forfeited.

- Performance Leap'n'Chase. Placement rosettes for 1st-4th place winners at each height of Round 2. No awards for round one. Prize money shall be computed based upon 15% of the total entry fees and evenly divided among the first place dogs of each jump height.
- Dog Agility Masters Team Tournament:
  - ✓ Plaque for overall 1st place team. Overall team placement rosettes will be awarded to the 1st through 6th place. Qualifying patches will be awarded to members of all qualifying teams.
  - ✓ An award for the highest-placing nonmasters team (any team with zero or one masters dog(s) on it).
  - ✓ An award for the highest scoring team in each team class, not including the team relay class.
- Performance Pairs Pentathlon:
  - ✓ Award for overall 1<sup>st</sup> place pair. Overall placement rosettes will be awarded to the 1<sup>st</sup> through 4<sup>th</sup> place.
  - ✓ An award for the highest-placing nonmasters pair (any pair with zero or one masters dog(s) on it).
  - ✓ An award for the highest scoring pair in each pent class, not including the pairs relay class.







## **Program Descriptions**

Two certification programs will be offered at this event – Championship & Performance. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance Program classes for which they are eligible; however, under NO circumstance may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class at this agility test (i.e. standard at any level in both programs). Classes include standard agility, gamblers, jumpers, pairs relay and snooker agility as set forth in Chapters 3 – 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations, each of which are conducted at three competitive levels.

CHAMPIONSHIP DOG AGILITY PROGRAM

The <u>Starters Standard</u> classes shall be for dogs that have not earned the *Agility Dog*\* title or a Starters Standard title. <u>Starters Non-standard classes</u> shall be for dogs that have not earned a title in the class being entered (Starters Gamblers, Starters Jumpers, Starters Relay-3 different partners required-or Starters Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Advanced or Masters level. When offered separately as Starters and Novice classes, the Starters level classes are for dogs handled by a person who has not previously earned the *Agility Dog* title or a title in the Performance or Veterans Program with any dog. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Agility Dog* title.

The <u>Advanced Standard</u> classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Agility Dog® title or a Starters Standard title. <u>Advanced non-standard classes</u> shall be for dogs that have earned the Agility Dog® title or that have earned a title in the equivalent non-standard class at the Starters level, but have not earned the equivalent Advanced non-standard title or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Masters level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the <u>Advanced Agility Dog</u> title.

The <u>Masters Standard</u> classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Advanced Agility Dog® title or the Advanced Standard title. <u>Masters non-standard classes</u> shall be for dogs that have earned the Advanced Agility Dog® title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Masters non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

#### Performance Program Classes

Generally, Performance Level I, Level II and Level III are run on courses used for Starters, Advanced and Masters classes in the Championship Program, with the following exceptions: the A-frame is set at 5'6", jump heights are one height class lower as set forth in Notes to Competitors, no spread hurdles are utilized and time standards in the standard, jumpers classes are extended by 3 seconds beyond that utilized in the Championship Program and the pairs relay class is non-qualifying. Eligibility is determined as follows:

The <u>Performance I Standard</u> classes shall be for any dog that has not earned the Performance Dog I<sup>SM</sup> title, the Performance Standard I title, or a qualifying score in the Performance II or Performance III standard classes. <u>Performance I non-standard classes</u> shall be for any dog that has not earned a title in the class being entered (Performance I Gamblers, Performance I Jumpers, or Performance I Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Performance II or Performance III level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the non-standard classes is required to earn the Performance Dog I<sup>SM</sup> title.

The <u>Performance II Standard</u> classes shall be for any dog that has earned the Performance Dog I<sup>SM</sup> title, the Performance Standard I title, the Agility Dog® title or the Veteran Agility Dog<sup>SM</sup> title, but has not earned the Performance Dog II<sup>SM</sup> title or Performance Standard II title, or a qualifying score in the Performance III standard class. <u>Performance II non-standard classes</u> shall be for dogs having earned the Performance Dog I<sup>SM</sup> title, the Agility Dog® title or a title in the equivalent Starters or Performance I non-standard class, but not having earned a title in the equivalent non-standard Performance III class or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard Performance III class. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the Performance Dog II<sup>SM</sup> title.

The <u>Performance III Standard</u> classes shall be for any dog that has earned the Performance Dog II<sup>SM</sup> title, the Performance Standard II title, the Advanced Agility Dog<sup>SM</sup> title, or the Veteran Advanced Agility Dog<sup>SM</sup> title. <u>Performance III non-standard classes</u> shall be for dogs having earned the Performance Dog II<sup>SM</sup> title, the Advanced Agility Dog<sup>®</sup> title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced or Performance III level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Performance non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

## Nonstandard Class Descriptions

**Gamblers Class:** This class consists of a course with no pre-determined route, and each obstacle is assigned a point value. In the "opening" period the handler seeks to accumulate points by performing the obstacles of his/her choice in the time allotted. At the conclusion of the "opening" period, the handler attempts the "gamble," a sequence designated by the judge to be handled from a distance, for added points. This nonstandard class is pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

**Jumpers Class:** This class consists of a course of jumps, and MAY include a tire and/or tunnels. This non-standard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

**Snooker Class:** This class has an "opening" sequence of point collection similar to the Gamblers followed by a closing sequence of a set pattern. This class requires the dog to successfully complete a "red" jump prior to attempting an obstacle designated as any other color. This nonstandard class is pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

Pairs Relay: This class consists of a standard course with one dog and handler running the first portion of the course, followed by a baton exchange to a second handler and dog that run the second portion of the course. This nonstandard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations

Oscar's Pairs – A non-titling game just for fun, this is Pairs Relay for any dog not entered in Championship pairs relay. Entrants can combine dogs of any height and any level. This class looks a lot like a pairs class with a baton exchange box except that it will be judged using Advanced rules.
