NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Competitors through submission of entry acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA rules and regulations including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry: USDAA's official rules & regulations, as amended January 1, 2004, are hereby incorporated by reference, a copy of which may be obtained for \$7.00 (postage and handling included) online at www.usdaa.com, USDAA Store, or send a check to: USDAA, P.O. Box 850955, Richardson, TX 75085-0955.

This test is open to all dogs being at least eighteen (18) months of age, including purebred and non-purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness that may affect the dog's physical or mental performance, or dogs exhibiting sign of aggression.

All dogs must be registered with USDAA® in order to compete. If your dog is not already registered, go to www.usdaa.com, General Information, to obtain a registration number immediately and a measurement card prior to the show, OR fill out the USDAA registration form included in this test schedule and add the registration fee of \$18.00 to your entry fee (Do not send a check made out to USDAA, Thanks)

Fault Limits may be imposed by the Organizing Committee and judge and will be announced in the judge's briefing.

There will be no equipment familiarization on either day.

There will be a general briefing for all handlers Saturday morning.

Individual briefings will be held for all classes at all levels.

All dogs must be ringside and ready to run in catalog order.

The **running order** will be determined by random draw. For those handlers with more than one dog in a class; we will do our best to separate your runs.

No food or toys will be permitted on or around the course at any time. Training collars (pinch, shock or others) will not be permitted on the fairgrounds at any time. Unentered dogs will be allowed on the event grounds, provided they are under control of their owners/handlers. Owners/handlers of dogs that are not entered in the trial will be asked to remove their dogs from the event grounds if they are disruptive.

ALL DOGS present **must** be held on leash or otherwise confined except when being judged or in the Warm Up area.

We also ask for your cooperation in cleaning up after your dog and yourself at the fairgrounds, as well as at our motel facilities. It is increasingly difficult for clubs to obtain show sites. Cooperation and abidance of the rules will assist us in being welcomed back. The fairgrounds requires that all poop be bagged before being deposited in a dumpster. If we do not adhere to this we will be required in the future to rent a dumpster. Please help us keep our costs down. We don't want to have to pass this cost on.

Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. There will be a \$15.00 service charge for returned checks. Payment of entry fees and service charges shall be made in cash or money order within 30 days of postmark of notice of returned check where notification is received after event date. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration number(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is canceled without recourse by owner/handler.

Notice To Competitors (con't)

The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee views that participation by competitor or dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for their decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee. In addition, THERE WILL BE NO REFUNDS for entries withdrawn after the closing date or in the event a dog and/or handler is dismissed from the competition, regardless of the reason for dismissal, except that a partial refund may be given, at the discretion of the Show Committee, upon presentation of a veterinarian's certificate that the dog was injured or a bitch was in season on the date of the event. Entries may not be accepted, canceled, changed or altered after the closing date except for the purpose of moving to a higher level by the secondary closing date of September 19, 2005. It is expressly understood that Competitors alone are responsible for

the behavior of their dogs, children and guests. Any competitor whose dogs, children, or guests create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior, may at the discretion of the show committee, be asked to remove the offending dogs, children, guests from the event grounds. No refunds of fees will be made in such a case.

All competitors through entry at this event waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast of this event. Competitors shall have the right to videotape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial or other purposes. All video, broadcast and telecast rights for this event are the exclusive property of United States Dog Agility Association®, Inc.

Portions of this event may be taped for television. Through entry at this event, ALL COMPETITORS and HANDLERS HEREBY GRANT to USDAA® and its representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media now known. All competitors and handlers hereby release USDAA® and its representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right.

JUMP HEIGHTS AND AGILITY OBSTACLES

Following are the jump heights for the Championship Program (Performance heights in parenthesis):

Obstacles for all classes will be chosen from those described in the current edition of the Official Rules and Regulations of the United States Dog Agility Association, Inc. In addition, other obstacles and/or hurdles which are not specifically described in the USDAA Official Rules & Regulations, but which conform to USDAA Standards and are otherwise permissible may be used.

Non-Standard Classes

<u>GAMBLERS</u>: The Gamblers Class consists of a course with no pre-determined route and each obstacle is assigned a point value. In the "opening" period, the handler seeks to accumulate points by performing the obstacles of his/her choice in the time allotted. At the conclusion of the "opening", the handler attempts the "gamble", a sequence designated by the judge to be handled from a distance, for additional points. This nonstandard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA® Rules and Regulations.

<u>Jumpers</u>: The Jumpers Class consists of a course of jumps and may include a tire and tunnels. This nonstandard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA® Rules and Regulations.

SNOOKER: The Snooker Class has an "opening" sequence of point collection similar to Gamblers class followed by a closing sequence of a set pattern. It roughly parallels the billiards game of "Snooker", requiring the dog to successfully complete a "red" jump prior to attempting an obstacle designated as any other color. This nonstandard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA® Rules and Regulations.

<u>PAIRs</u>: The pairs Relay Class consists of a standard course with one dog and handler running a portion of the course, followed by a baton exchange to a second handler and dog who run the second portion of the course This nonstandard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 of USDAA® Rules and Regulations.

<u>Performance Pairs Relay</u>: is a non-titling class open to all dogs regardless of level not entered in one of the championship program pairs relay classes at this event. Any height may pair with any other height, and level with any level. Otherwise, this class follows the same rules as the Advanced pairs relay classes and will be run on the advanced pairs course with appropriate modifications pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 7.

2006 USDAA® Grand Prix of Dog Agility® Local Qualifier

This class is open to all dogs regardless of title or skill level - a single-round tournament featuring the sport in its basic form. The course includes an A-frame, dog walk, see-saw, pipe tunnel, collapsed tunnel, weave poles, tire jump and a variety of other jumps and hurdles. Scoring follows regulations for standard scoring under Masters rules, except that time standards may generally range from 3.50 yards per second to 3.75 yards per second for dogs competing in the 22" and 26" height classes and from 2.85 to 3.05 yards per second in the 12" height class and from 3.10 to 3.40 yards per second for dogs competing in the 16" height class. Dogs that earn seven (7) or fewer faults shall earn a qualifying score

2006 National Performance Standardsm Championships Local Qualifier

This class is open to all dogs regardless of title or skill level not entered in the Grand Prix tournament at this event. A single-round tournament featuring the sport in its basic form. The course includes an A-frame, dog walk, see-saw, pipe tunnel, collapsed tunnel, weave poles, tire jump and a variety of other jumps and hurdles. Scoring follows regulations for standard scoring under Masters rules. Since this class is conducted using the modified Grand Prix course, a standard course time is calculated by adding three seconds to the standard course time as determined for the Grand Prix. Dogs that earn seven (7) or fewer faults shall earn a qualifying score

Further changes regarding other aspects of these tournaments for 2006 may be forthcoming. A complete copy of the 2006 tournament rules, which are hereby incorporated by reference, will be posted at the event, or may be obtained directly from USDAA.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Two certification programs will be offered at this event – Championship & Performance. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance Program classes for which they are eligible; however, under NO circumstance may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class at this agility test (i.e. standard at any level in both programs). Classes include standard agility, gamblers, jumpers, pairs relay and snooker agility as set forth in Chapters 3 – 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations, each of which are conducted at three competitive levels.

CHAMPIONSHIP DOG AGILITY PROGRAM

The <u>Starters Standard</u> classes shall be for dogs that have not earned the <u>Agility Dog®</u> title or a Starters Standard title. <u>Starters Non-standard classes</u> shall be for dogs that have not earned a title in the class being entered (Starters Gamblers, Starters Jumpers, Starters Relay-3 different partners required-or Starters Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Advanced or Masters level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the <u>Agility Dog</u> title.

The <u>Advanced Standard</u> classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Agility Dog® title or a Starters Standard title. <u>Advanced non-standard classes</u> shall be for dogs that have earned the Agility Dog® title or that have earned a title in the equivalent non-standard class at the Starters level, but have not earned the equivalent Advanced non-standard title or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Masters level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Advanced Agility Dog* title.

The <u>Masters Standard</u> classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Advanced Agility Dog® title or the Advanced Standard title. <u>Masters non-standard classes</u> shall be for dogs that have earned the Advanced Agility Dog® title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Masters non-standard class prior to January 1, 2005. Performance Program Classes

Generally, Performance Level I, Level II and Level III are run on courses used for Starters, Advanced and Masters classes in the Championship Program, with the following exceptions: the Aframe is set at 5'6", jump heights are one height class lower as set forth in Notes to Competitors, no spread hurdles are utilized and time standards in the standard, jumpers classes are extended by 3 seconds beyond that utilized in the Championship Program and the pairs relay class is non-qualifying. Eligibility is determined as follows:

The <u>Performance I Standard</u> classes shall be for any dog that has not earned the Performance Dog title, the Performance Standard I title, or a qualifying score in the Performance II or Performance III standard classes. <u>Performance I non-standard classes</u> shall be for any dog that has not earned a title in the class being entered (Performance I Gamblers, Performance I Jumpers, or Performance I Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Performance II or Performance III level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the non-standard classes is required to earn the Performance Dog title.

The Performance II Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the Performance Dog SM title, the Performance Standard I title, the Agility Dog® title or the Veteran Agility Dog SM title, but has not earned the Performance Dog II SM title or Performance Standard II title, or a qualifying score in the Performance III standard class. Performance II non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the Performance Dog M title, the Agility Dog® title or a title in the equivalent Starters or Performance I non-standard class, but not having earned a title in the equivalent non-standard Performance III class. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the Performance Dog II M title. The Performance III Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the Performance Dog II M title, the Performance Standard II title, the Advanced Agility Dog M title, or the Veteran Advanced Agility Dog M title, the Performance III non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the Performance Dog II M title, the Advanced Agility Dog® title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced or Performance III level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Performance non-standard class prior to January 1, 2005.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

- Standard and Non-Standard Classes: Rosettes will be awarded for 1st through 4th place in each competition level at each jump height. Pairs Relay will be broken into Mini and Open levels for ribbons. The entire Performance Pairs will compete for a single set of 1st through 4th place placement ribbons.
- Grand Prix and Perf Natl Standard: Maroon and white ribbons will be awarded to Championship and maroon & pink ribbons will be awarded to Performance for all qualifying scores.
- Grand Prix and Perf Natl Standard placements: Rosettes will be awarded for 1st through 6th place in each jump height.
