Thank you for entering our TRACS AKC ISC Red Solo Cup! This is a preliminary judging schedule.

Upon receiving your entry, you were emailed a TRACS Red Solo Cup entry confirmation. Please ensure you have read through this carefully for any oversights or typos. Any changes need to be made before the event by emailing pyrika@gmail.com.

AGILITY TRIAL SITE DIRECTIONS:

From the Bay Area via I-80 East: Take I-80 East towards Sacramento. Exit I-80 onto CA-113 North (just past Dixon) towards Woodland for 8.7 miles. Take Exit 34, Road 25A. Follow Rd 25A for approximately .45 miles and turn right onto East Street. Follow East Street for 1.88 miles and turn right onto East Gum Ave. The fairgrounds will be on your right.

From I-5 North/SR-99 North: If you come up 99, you will merge onto I-5 north just past Sacramento (goes past the Sacramento International Airport). Follow I-5 north to Ex 537, CA 113S / Woodland. Turn left off the exit ramp onto East Main Street. Follow East Main for approximately 1.1 miles, then turn left on East Street. In .6 miles, turn left onto East Gum Ave. Fairgrounds Entrance will be on your right.

MAPS

Maps will be available on the Agility Gate app around 6:00am each day.

GATES AND EVENT INFORMATION

ARRIVING AT THE TRIAL SITE / RETURNING AFTER DINNER:

- Each day, the Main Fairgrounds entrance gate (off Gum Ave near the RV Park) and the black inner gate open at approximately 7:00 am . If you arrive before 7:00 am, you will

have to wait in the entrance drive until the gate is opened. There is a possibility that we may be late in opening the gate.

- Both gates (the black inner gate and the silver RV park gate) will be locked at 9:00 pm on Thursday, Friday and Sunday. If you are staying on the grounds and choose to go out after the trial is over, you MUST return before 9 pm or you will not be able to get back in.
- While TRACS does have the ability to unlock the gates for emergencies, your staying out too late while socializing does not constitute an emergency. Please be considerate of our people who have been working all day to support the trial. If you come back to the site late, you are asking them to get out of bed and make their way across the Fairgrounds to the gates if you don't arrive / get back on time.
- If you are staying on site and, for reasons beyond your control such as traffic accidents or other travel delays, you will arrive after the 9 pm gate closure, you can contact us to after hours entry, but please do that as soon as you know you will arrive late.

UNLOADING AND PARKING

- Once through the inner black gate, "Main Street" (the two-lane road that leads from the black gate down through the trial area), will be blocked off in both directions beginning at 7:30 am each day through the end of judging. This is for the safety of exhibitors and dogs.
- If you arrive after 7:30 am, there is an unloading area where you can park temporarily to unload your stuff or you may drive around the perimeter (see Daily Driving Map) to a Daily Parking area. There is a 15-minute unloading time limit. After that, you must move your car to one of the day parking areas.
- There are a number of areas that we have had access in the past for parking and set up that are no longer available for us to use. Please be sure to look at the attached grounds map to see this year's available space.
- There are a number of areas inside the Fairgrounds where you can park for the day. See the attached site map for these areas. Please do not park within about 20 feet of an RV hookup or you will be asked to move if an RV needs to park there. No vehicles of any kind (with the exception of the TRACS trailers and tow vehicles), may park on any paved roads/pathways (fire lanes).
- The interiors of all barns/buildings are off limits to cars/set ups. This is a Fairgrounds rule.

EXITING THE FAIRGROUNDS:

During the day: If you need to depart the Fairgrounds while the trial is underway, you will need to drive the long way around the site back to the main gate. This route is shown on the site map later in this judging schedule.

FOR AFTER HOURS ENTRY / EXIT HELP:

If you have an emergency and need to leave the Fairgrounds after 9:00 pm, you will have to use the emergency exit gate off of East Street. To get this gate unlocked contact Sandy Zajkowski at 916-501-8319.

SET UP CREW:

- If you wish to help with set up, please contact Channan Fosty (c.fosty@comcast.net) by Wednesday, October 22nd to be added to the set-up crew list. ONLY SET UP CREW will be allowed to set up ringside or bring their RVs in before 3:00 pm.
- Trial Set up is scheduled to begin around 1:00 pm, although if we have sufficient help, we may get started earlier.

RINGSIDE CANOPY SETUP:

- The rings will be outside on grass with limited shade, so remember to bring your own shade.
- General exhibitor set up begins at 3:00 pm or when all set up work is finished (trailers unloaded, rings set, fencing up, infrastructure areas set up, canopies up and staked...) If you try to set up prior to that time, you will be asked to either stop and wait for the appropriate time, or you can always join in the set up fun.
- Please ensure all set ups are at least 15' back off the ring ropes.
- There may be no personal canopies set up along the entry/exit side of the rings.

Note: There are several reserved areas and walk through spaces that were marked off during set up. If you set your canopy up in a "designated walk-through area" or other reserved space, you will be asked to move, regardless of the time.

UNATTENDED DOGS:

In accordance with AKC rules, all dogs must be on leash and attached to a human being. Please do not tie your dog to any of the club canopies, leave them unattended in/on chairs, or in an unattended down stay next to the ring while walking your course. If you are early in the running order, you can bring a crate to ringside to stage your dog so you can be ready immediately following the walk through. However, you will have to remove it after your run to keep congestion down near the rings. Also, remember that, there will be a five-minute break from the end of each walk through to the first dog on the line.

RV PARKING:

- Overnight parking (RVs, Trailers, cars/vans, tents) is by advance registration only.
- Only trial key workers will have assigned parking spots.
- Sandra Zajkowski, the RV Coordinator, will be sending out a general map to all those who have sent in an RV parking request. This map will have RV parking locations identified.
- General RV Parking is on a first come, first serve basis.
- RVers not on the set up list may come into park at 3:00 pm. If you get to the Fairgrounds before 3:00 pm, please wait in the outer parking lot.
- RVers may not set up ring side before the 3:00 pm general set up time.

CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG: Please clean up after your dog. Let's show them that "Dog People" are clean people.

DO NOT LEAVE ANIMALS UNATTENDED IN VEHICLE! The club will not be responsible for damage to vehicles resulting from the rescue of overheated animals!

HOSPITALITY:

TRACS will provide a buffet style lunch shared between AKC and USDAA for all keyworkers, full time workers and volunteers of at least two classes. This will be on the honor system. In general, lunch will be available from approximately 11:30 am – 2:00 pm.

If you would like to contribute something to the buffet, please contact our Lunch Coordinator, Sharon Murphy at slmreo@sbcglobal.net and let her know what you would like to bring and on which day.

WORKERS:

- We will have some full time workers, but we can still use lots of other help! Worker Sign up Boards will be posted at ring side. Simply sign up on the white board and listen for the Ring Crew Chief to call for your class.
- Once you have signed up, please check in with your ring crew chief 10 minutes before you are scheduled to work. This really helps keep things moving along. Be sure to come to Scoring at the end of your trial to redeem your worker bucks!

SCORING, QUESTIONS, POSTING:

- Scores will be posted near scoring. Please check your results as soon as possible so we may resolve any questions you may have before the judge forgets what your run was like! If you have a question, ask!.
- Daily results will be taken down each night.
- If you have any questions about anything other than scoring, or have any feedback about ways we can improve our trial, don't be shy about saying something.

NOTES ON ISC EQUIPMENT

- Tire heights and spread jumps will be set to FCI standards.
- The ring may not be fully fenced and there will be no ring gates used.

AWARDS:

Qualification ribbons will be awarded on request only.

AGILITY GATE APP:

- Exhibitors are requested to download the free phone app, Agility Gate. The app is free through the iPhone App Store or the Google Play Store. The app has a purple background. The trial code for this event is 1025 (first day of the event).
- Run orders will be posted each evening. Course maps will be available sometime after 6:00 am each morning. If the maps are not posted exactly at 6:00 am, check back later. Please DO NOT call the trial chair or trial secretary. This is out of our control at this point.

- The app gives you access to the course maps and this is how you will check in for your classes.
- You will not need your phone at the gate. There will be iPads (other than the gate stewards') near rings 1 and 2 where you can check the running order. Ring 3 (ISC Ring) will only have the Gate Steward iPad, but you can peer over the Gate Steward's shoulder to find out what you are looking for.
- The gate steward will still call your dog's name just like shows in the past. If you have multiple dogs running too close together in the run, then mark them with a "conflict" via the Gate app. If you do not have access to the Agility Gate app, you can ask a friend to mark the conflict for you or you can request the Gate Steward do this at ringside.

MEASURING:

All dogs, regardless of jump height, who are under two years of age and do not have a temporary height card or are over two years of age and do not have a permanent height card must be measured prior to their first run of the weekend. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure their dog is measured before their first run. Measurement of dogs will take place immediately before and after the briefing. Jan is not a VMO so measurements will NOT count toward the dog's permanent height card.

CONFLICTS:

Conflicts between the two rings should be marked in the Agility Gate app. Communicate with the Gate Stewards as soon as you suspect a conflict and we will work with the USDAA team to figure out which ring should be run first. As long as we know about it, we will make sure you get your runs.

FOR EXHIBITION ONLY (FEO)

- For Exhibition Only will be offered. FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.
- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is unable to obtain a qualifying score.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring *prior to leading out* to the scribe and judge.

FIX AND GO ON (FNG)

- Fix and Go On (FNG) is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.
- FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note.
- FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

- Exhibitors are not to signal they are using FNG – the judge will signal the scribe appropriately.

BITCHES IN SEASON (BIS)

BIS will be permitted to compete at this event. Handlers with bitches in season are requested to indicate on the run order prior to their run and take appropriate precautions to minimize disruption.

Red Solo Cup - International Sweepstakes Classes (ISC)

Purpose: The International Sweepstakes Class (ISC) is a non-regular class providing the dog and handler an opportunity to demonstrate their advanced training and handling skills on various International Style Standard (Agility) and Jumpers with Weaves courses. The rules for this class are generally based on international rules. The variety in International Agility course designs is very diverse, so handlers should be prepared to meet the “Challenge of the Day” when competing in the ISC class. The total challenge level may be easier, more difficult, or simply different from what is currently allowed in Excellent / Master Class. Complete rules for the ISC are available from the AKC Website (<http://www.akc.org>).

Eligibility: ISC classes are open to all dogs that are eligible to compete in AKC agility trials. There is no Preferred Option for ISC. Dogs may enter at their preferred jump height; however, they will be scored against the regular division dogs jumping their regular height. For example: 16” preferred dogs will be scored against 20” regular division dogs. Eligible dogs may be entered in any level of ISC. At present, there are no eligibility requirements for any level of ISC and any dog that is eligible according to the information in this premium list may run any level.

Red Solo Cup Winners in the A3 Final

The ISC Agility 3 (ISC A3) Final class on Sunday **can be entered by anyone**; however only certain teams can win the Red Solo Cup based on their score in Sunday’s A3 ISC Agility class.

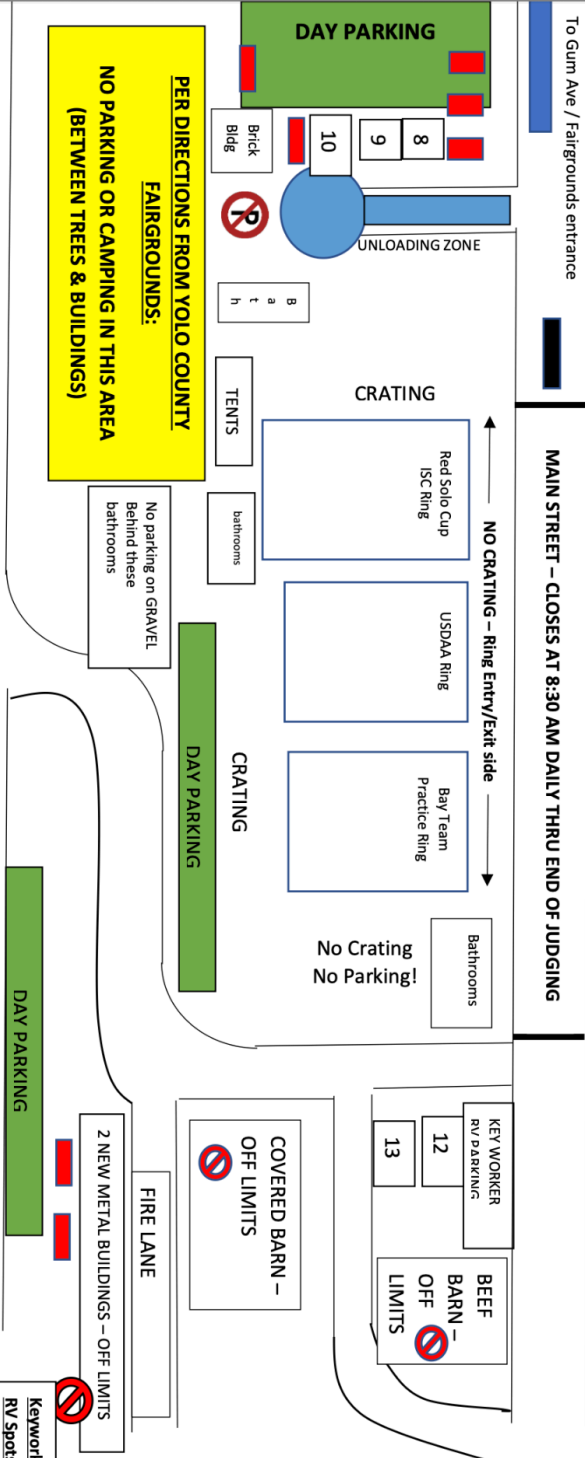
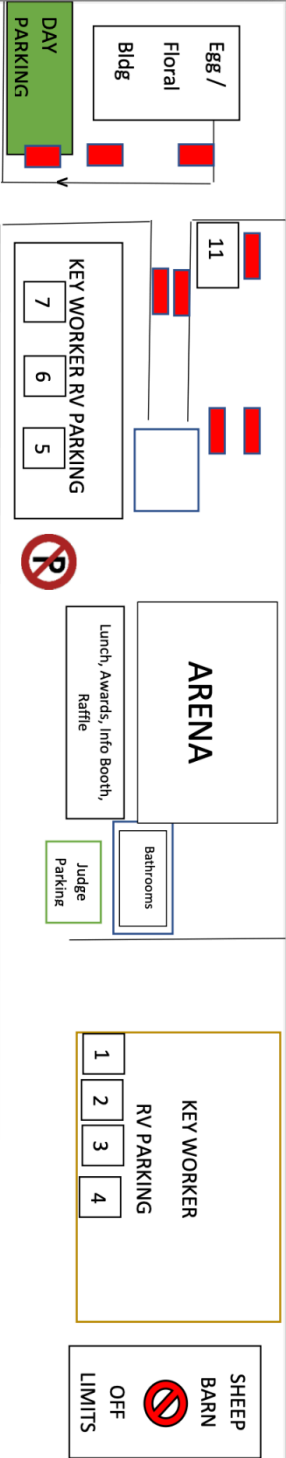
In order to be eligible to win the Red Solo Cup, teams:

- Must be entered in at least one of the ISC classes other than the Sunday ISC A3 class
- Must be entered in the Sunday ISC A3 class
- Must (a) finish one of the previous ISC runs in the top 40% of their jump height as scored on a Faults then Time basis, (b) finish under the Standard Course Time (SCT) defined by the judge of record, and (c) not have a result of an “E,” defined as going off course or accumulating 3 or more refusals in a run.

There will be a podium for the top 3 finishers in each height in the Sunday ISC A3 class out of the competitors satisfying the above criteria. Placements for the Red Solo Cup Finals will be based on individual scores in the final class, as scored on a Faults then Time basis. Eligible scores will be under SCT and not have a result of an “E” as described above. First place

finishers in each height will receive a special prize which is TBD. Please follow the Facebook page for the Red Solo Cup for further details.

NOTE: Since the Sunday ISC A3 class can be entered by ANYONE, a “clean run” in the class can be used for WTT/EOTT qualifications as defined by the rules for WTT/EOTT.
