This is to highlight some information that applies to people staying onsite

First and foremost, the fairground is booking multiple events or maintenance on any weekend. This has led to some areas being marked as off limits to parking and camping – I have tried to notate those on the map but that does not preclude that during our weekend that the restricted areas will not increase or change.

Gate Hours: The main and black gates are open as follows

Friday: 9 a.m. – 9 p.m.

Saturday-Sunday: 7 a.m.-9 p.m.

Please be cognizant of your time if you leave the fairgrounds. If you have any questions during the show on this, please talk to me.

If you arrive prior to the gate being opened, please wait in the outer parking lot. If there is a delay opening, please be patient.

Returning to fairgrounds after 9 p.m. – (See attached map) if you find that you are not able to return prior to the main gates being locked (staying out late for dinner is not an emergency) you will need to use the emergency entrance gate off East Street. For after-hours assistance on **Thursday** please contact Sandra at 916 501-8319.

FRIDAY - set up

If you are **not** part of set up, you may not enter the show site until **3:00 PIM** - please wait in the outer parking lot until then

Otherwise:

11:00-12:30	TRACS trailer and Touch & Go trailer (ISC equipment) could arrive, and the ring corners will be set
1:00	Only setup crew may arrive and set up their RVs (if applicable) and/or set up ringside
1:00 - 3:00	Set up is happening
3:00	General Exhibitors may arrive and setup RVs and/or ringside

Please refer to the attached map for available RV/tent spaces:

If you are a key worker, we have specific areas reserved but some spaces within those areas are for specific people (look for **RED or PINK FLAG).** If there is no flag, any key worker can park.

If you are not a key worker, the map will also show general areas (Red) where electrical hookups are available. It is first come first serve.

Electrical:

The fairgrounds mainly have 50-amp hookups. If you need 30-amp please bring an adapter with you. Also, you may be asked to share a 50 amp so an adapter that will split the 1 50-amp into 2 30-amps would also be handy to have. It would also be prudent to bring an RV extension cord in case you need that little extra to reach the hookup.

There are quite a few 110 hookups available throughout the fairgrounds – some are standalone plugs but the majority are on the same post as the 50-amps. Bring an extra extension cord to be sure you can reach.

Water:

While the fairgrounds have added electrical hookups they have also removed several water faucets. Be sure to fill you tanks before coming as we cannot guarantee a water hookup.

Like the electrical, the water faucets are not proprietary to any specific space. Bring splitters with you and be ready to share with you neighbor.

Showers:

The fairgrounds have not had showers for several years.
