Wait List: Two Rivers Agility Club of Sacramento is offering a Wait List to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trials closing date. A maximum of 100 runs will be placed on the club's wait list. All entries, including wait listed entries, must be received by the Trial Secretary prior to 11:00 pm on May 12, 2017. Any entries withdrawn that have been received by 11:00 pm on May 12, 2017. Any entries withdrawn that have been received by a wait listed entry if any are available. If a withdrawn entry is replaced by a wait list entry, a full refund **less a \$5 processing fee** will be issued to the withdrawn entry. Any wait listed entry that does not move off the wait list into the trial by 6:00 pm on Monday, May 22, 2017 will receive a full refund.

- This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds.
- Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

- Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind or deaf shall not be eligible and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under four months of age are strictly prohibited from the trial grounds.
- Mixed breed dogs that have been listed with AKC Canine Partners may participate provided their listing number has been recorded on the entry form and must list "Canine Partner" (mixed breed) for the breed name on the entry form. No other breed description may be used to identify a mixed breed entry. Additionally, the exhibitor must provide their AKC Canine Partners listing number on the entry form and check-mark "AKC No."
- > Running order will be determined by a random draw. Handlers with more than one dog will have those dogs separated as much as possible.
- > No hand deliveries for the first 24 hours after opening date and time. Maximum of 10 entries per envelope.
- There will be no refunds for entries withdrawn after the closing date except in the event of injury to dog or handler or bitches in season. In the case of injury, entries will be refunded (minus expenses) provided the trial secretary is notified in writing prior to the trial

Novice A –	For persons and dogs that have NEVER acquired an agility title.

If the dog is crossing over from the Regular classes to the Preferred classes, they may be entered at the level the dog is eligible to compete at in the Regular classes.

Novice Preferred -All dogs entering the Preferred Classes for the first time must enter the Novice level regardless of the previous titles. Novice
Preferred is NOT split into A and B divisions.Open Preferred -For dogs that have acquired the Novice Preferred or Open Preferred titles or the Novice or Open titles, but have not earned a
qualifying score in the Excellent or Excellent Preferred class.Excellent Preferred -For dogs that have acquired the Open or Open Preferred title, but have not completed the Excellent Preferred title.Master Preferred -For dogs that have completed the Excellent or Excellent Preferred title.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: INTERNATIONAL SWEEPSTAKES CLASSES:

Purpose: The International Sweepstakes Class (ISC) is a non regular class providing the dog and handler an opportunity to demonstrate their advanced training and handling skills on various International Style Standard and Jumpers with Weaves courses. The rules for this class are generally based on international rules. The variety in International Agility course designs is very diverse, so handlers should be prepared to meet the "Challenge of the Day" when competing in the ISC class. The total challenge level may be easier, more difficult, or simply different from what is currently allowed in Excellent / Master Class. Complete rules for the ISC are available from the AKC Website (http://www.akc.org).

- Eligibility: This class is open <u>ONLY</u> to dogs that are eligible to compete in <u>BOTH</u> the Excellent / Master Standard Class <u>AND</u> the Excellent / Master Jumpers with Weaves Class. <u>There is no Preferred Option for ISC</u>; dogs may enter at their preferred jump height, however they will be scored against the regular division dogs jumping the same jump height.
 - Jump Heights: Dogs may be entered in their regular jump height, however, only those dogs in the 12 & 16" class that meet the FCI/ISC measuring cutoff (different than regular AKC cutoffs), or any dog entering the 24" jump height will be eligible for the direct invitation to the 2018 World Team Tryouts.

Small (12" jump height) – for dogs measuring 13 $\frac{3}{4}$ " and/or less at the withers Medium (16" jump height) – for dogs measuring over 13 $\frac{3}{4}$ " but 16 7/8" or less Large (24" jump height) – for dog measuring over 16 7/8"

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: TIME TO BEAT:

Purpose: This optional agility titling class is meant to challenge the handler/dog to set a clean efficient line with an emphasis on speed and accuracy. The dog that sets the quickest time in each jump height will set the time to beat for that jump height. There will be a single class level and all dogs with any skill level (e.g. Novice, Open, Excellent, Master) will compete on the same course.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: PREMIER STANDARD AND JWW:

PURPOSE: These optional titling classes are designed to challenge dogs and handlers at an increased speed and skill level above those set for the Master level classes. Handlers/dogs will need to negotiate courses that required varied approach angles, spacing and obstacle discriminations to be successful in these classes. These classes are offered as separate titling tracks and are not part of the MACh/PACh Championships, however, these classes ARE part of the new GRAND CHAMPIONSHIP title as well as they can be used to fulfill some AKC Nationals Qualifying requirements.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: Dogs with an AX are eligible to enter Premier Standard Regular. Dogs with an AX or AXP are eligible to enter Premier Standard Preferred. Dogs with an AXJ are eligible to enter Premier Jumpers with Weaves Regular. Dogs with an AXJ or AJP are eligible to enter Premier Jumpers with Weaves. Dog with Regular titles may crossover to the Premier Preferred level as noted above.

HEIGHT DIVISION CHART

Exhibitors may opt to enter in a higher height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes <u>must</u> compete at the required jump height and <u>may not</u> compete in a jump height division <u>higher or lower</u> than their proper height division. Owners are responsible for entering the proper height divisions. If your dog has been measured by an AKC Field Representative or Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO) and is now eligible to jump in a lower height class, the measurement is effective immediately including any runs (regular or preferred class) which have not yet occurred on the same day that the measurement is recorded. This immediate action does not apply to measurements taken as part of completing the challenge measurement process. Dogs who measure into a higher jump height have always been required to be moved immediately.

MEASURING and HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION

Effective January 1, 2010, exhibitors are no longer required to provide proof to Trial Secretaries that their dog has a valid jump height card as part of the check-in process. Furthermore, this change eliminates the need for a copy of the jump height card to be submitted with an entry form. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; however they must be measured/wicketed by the Judge of Record PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. The exception to this requirement is a dog entered in the 24" or 26" height division. However, if a **Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO)** or an **Agility Field Rep** is present, **ALL** dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog wicketed by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog *before* its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.

HELP WANTED:
